Hanne Tofte Jespersen's broad artistic work is rooted in both classical and ethnic music. From early childhood she was taught classical piano, as a teenager also singing, graduated from high school with music as a major and from University of Copenhagen with a MA in music and a BA in film. In 1993-99 an interest in world music had led her to Ghana as co-leader of the Danidasponsored Ciltad-Agoro Project. She received her first commisssion in 2004, having then also graduated as an organist.

CURRENT ARTISTIC COLLABORATIONS

SPEECH OF THE SILENCED ONES / DE FORSTUMMEDES TALE - NEW "CLASSICAL CABARET"

This experimental production is centered around poems by Anna Akhmatova (1889-1966) which Hanne sets to music for soprano, violin, cello, piano with integrated recital by actor - as a parallel work to Shostakovich' Romances for poems by Aleksandr Blok (opus 127). PREMIERE 6.-8. Sept 2024.

An allegory of present times, the theme is ART AS A NECESSITY, A BLOWHOLE:

Around 1910 St Peterburg's cabaret stages were hot spots for avantgarde artists. They met in a short blooming of free creativity in Russian theatre. Among them were the stage director Vsevolod Mejrkhold and the poet Anna Akhmatova. Both became friends of Shostakovich.

5 songs for soprano Inger Dam Jensen and pianist Matts Janssons for poems by Inger Christensen. Songs for mezzo and piano, for baritone and piano, duet for mezzo, baritone and piano.

INSPIRATIONS

It was when she started composing for handed down scripts that Hanne Tofte Jespersen got hold of her unique way of expression. She draws inspiration from many years of absorption in mythology and mystery traditions, from poetry and other art forms as well as a broad spectrum of music traditions, incl. European classical instrumental music, Nordic and British choir music, folk tones and vocal traditions from many different cultures. She is also influenced by years of work with West African music, dance & storytelling traditions. This has led her to create series of interactive works for choreographed voices and instrumental ensemble, incl. collaborate works in which she has set contemporary rural and urban landscapes to music based on walks in local areas. She has often worked with integrated recital.

KEY WORDS to Hanne Tofte Jespersen's production:

- Music to Western mystery traditions:

In 2007 she formed Music for the Mysteries who toured the Nordic Countries and UK 2008-14 and recorded 2 CD's with her music, incl. *The Testimony of Melangell* based on the tale of a female hermit and saint around 500 AD, premiered 2011 as total art in visual installation and performed as choreographed concert in 2011-14. Later works include *Finding Consorts* (2019) for a broken consort of cornetto (zinck), baroque violin, viola da gamba and theorbo, inspired by the Welsh magical chess board *Gwyddbwell;* and the *ETRURIA Suite for violin and double bass* (2016, rev. 2020) inspired by an Etruscan artefact.

- Sinfonietta, Chamber, Solo voices, Choir:
- commissioned works include String Quartet *Times of Unrest* for Nordic String Quartet commissioned by Chamber Music Society BRAGE on behalf of 5 Danish chamber music societies; sinfonietta work for Esbjerg Ensemble; solo works for clarinetist Anna Klett and for violinist Kuno Kjærbye; songs for soprano and piano for Gitta-Maria Sjöberg & Polina Fradkina and for Noora Karhuluoma & Ida Andersson, trio work for clarinetist Catherine Wood, duo work for organist Sven-Ingvart Mikkelsen a.m.o. *Going to Heaven* (TTBBB) for Linköping Student Singers (SE).
- Interactive works for and with children/youth & professional ensembles:

 The Play of colours from 2013 won realisation in the DR Concert House. Since 2014 she has created series of collaborate projects which set urban and rural landscapes to music based on walks with local participants: If the Land Could Talk (2014-17 for Roskilde District), Vibrandring (2019 for Esbjerg Ensemble, 2021 for the festival Nordic Music Days).

RECENT ARTISTIC COLLABORATIONS

Duo Karhuluoma Andersson has premiered her "Å KOME TILBAKE DIT EIN ALDRIG FØR HAR VORE" for soprano and piano Oct 2022. This 10:45 min. is composed for a *credo*-like poem by Norwegian author Marit Tusvik; the title means "To Return To Where One Has Never Been Before". The duo commissioned it for their concerts with Nordic songs.

Canadian clarinettist Cathy Wood commissioned a duo for 2 cl and piano for her duo with Jenny MacClay. The piece was premiered during the Int. Clarinet Fest 2022 in Nevada, US. In 2021 Cathy Wood had taken part in Hanne Tofte Jespersen's project for sinfonietta during Nordic Music Days in the Faroe Islands.

Duo Kjærbye-Maschmann recorded her ETRURIA SUITE for Violin and Double Bass (15 min) in 2022 and performs it as part of their current tour programmes, in DK and DE 2024-25 and in New York at the Cutting Edge Concerts 2025.

Nordic String Quartet premiered her "STRING QUARTET No.1 UROLIGE TIDER" (*Times of Unrest*) in November 2020. Hanne Tofte Jespersen composed it for the context of Haydn's Opus 76,2 'Fifths' (1797) and Britten's String Quartet No.1 (1941) - three quartets all created in 'times of unrest'. In 2022 it has been recorded and released on CD Sept '22. The premiere was broadcasted by DR (Danish National Radio) and was very well received and reviewed. Apart from performances, the project offers additional educational and audience development programmes.

Violinist Kuno Kjærbye commissioned and premiered "FANTASIA in view of J.S.Bach" (2020) for his ongoing concert project with Bach's six solo sonatas/ partiten alongside with three new works for solo violin. Hanne Tofte Jespersen composed her piece for the context of Bach's C major Sonata and the E major Partita, inspired also by Helga Thoene's research of "hidden chorales" in Bach's solo sonatas. In 2022 Kjærbye has recorded the piece for an upcoming album.

Nordic Music Days selected her VIBRANDRING FO-100 project for the festival Sept. 2021 in the Faroe Islands. A collaborate project for singers and sinfonietta in which talented youth and professionals join forces.

Festival TIDLØS / Timeless 2021 produced "Finding Consorts" performed by a broken consort ensemble led by Andreas Arend (DE).

Gitta-Maria Sjöberg (SE/DK) & Polina Fradkina (RU) premiered 'PÅ GJENNOMREISE - 3 songs for soprano and piano for poems by Marit Tusvik' in 2018, during Roskilde Music Society's 50 yrs anniversary recorded them subsequently, released online in 2019. Esbjerg Ensemble commissioned 'VIBRANDRING' - a collaborate work for sinfonietta ensemble and talented youth, 2019. Landesmuseum Schloss Gottorf selected 'GOTTORFER TONGEWEBE' for an audio station after its German premiere in Schleswig (DE) 2017. HTJ composed this due for violin and organ for the unique acoustics of the Gottorf castle chapel.

MUSIC FOR THE MYSTERIES which Hanne Tofte Jespersen formed in 2007 has toured DK, UK, Faroe Islands and Iceland and has recorded 2 CDs with her music, incl. 'The Testimony of Melangell' (65 min) for contralto solo, SATB soloists, violin, double bass, piano, percussion and integrated recital; manus: Mike Harris (Wales, 1989). This work achieved 13 performances 2011-14, incl. as total artwork in 2011 with installation by visual artist Alison Michell (UK/DK).
